



## June 12, 2020:

CLX Logistics continues to monitor the impacts of the Covid-19 virus. As a company, we are focused on the safety of our employees and ensuring our customers are well supported through this time. We remain open for business and are operating under our business continuity plan. During this time, two-way communication is key. Please do not hesitate to reach out to us.

Below is a recap of key items impacting transportation today. It is a compilation of information from our team, carrier partners, customers, and industry sources.

## Regulatory / Governmental Updates:

- [FMCSA](#) information and resources website contains the latest updates to the Covid-19 outbreak.
- On [May 13<sup>th</sup>](#), FMCSA extended the Covid 19 exemption for essential supplies, equipment, and persons through June 14. The provision including grocery restocking, fuel, and precursor raw materials will be allowed to expire.
- As of [June 15](#) the extension for HOS relief will be limited to medical supplies related to testing, diagnosis, and treatment of Covid 19; livestock/livestock feed; and supplies necessary for community safety, sanitization, and prevention of community spread. The extension runs through July 14, 2020.

## Closures and Travel Restrictions:

- The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and Idaho National Laboratory (INL) have developed a website for truckers and other transportation professionals to understand the various restrictions found throughout the country. The Commercial Routing Assistance website can be accessed via [this link](#).
- Nearly all stay at home orders have expired, and states are “open”. The definition of what “open” entails varies by location in terms of businesses impacted and size of gatherings permitted. And some states, ex. Pennsylvania, Oregon, and Virginia, are opening portions of their state while other portions remain “closed.”
- The table of closures/openings lists either the planned re-opening date, or the expiration date of the stay at home orders by state.

- It is expected that the US/Canada border restriction will be [extended into July](#).

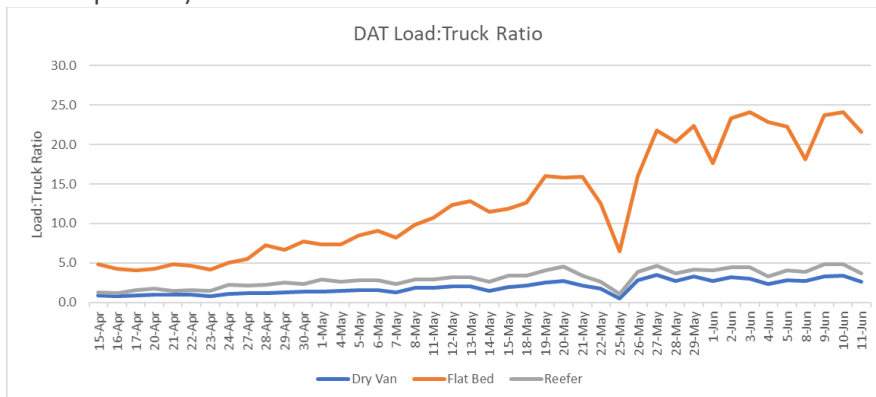
## Market Updates

### Bulk, LTL & Truckload (Van/Reefer/Flatbed):

- As has been the case for the past several weeks, we are not hearing reports of any widespread disruptions in service due to driver illness across any of the modes.
- [Driver turnover](#) hit an all-time low during March.

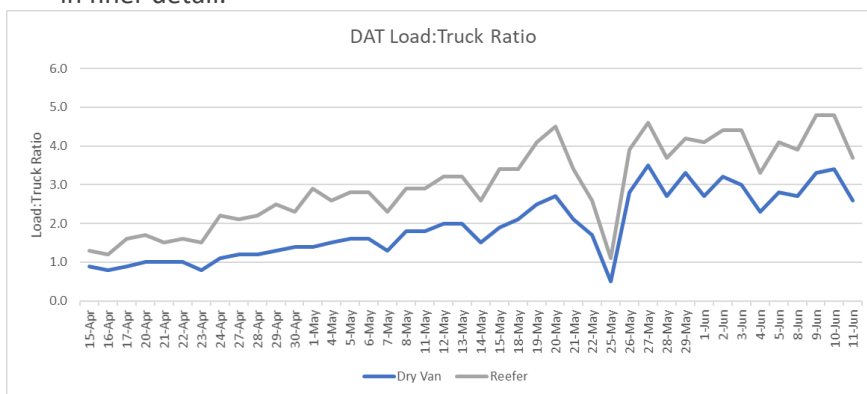
### Trend info for Dry Van/Reefer/Flatbed:

- Spot market activity increased 18.4% overall last week in comparison to the prior week, per DAT.
- Van shipment load to truck ratio decreased by 4.2% last week.
- Reefer shipment load to truck ratio increased by 5.8% last week.
- Flatbed shipment load to truck ratio increased by 12.3% last week.
- The table below is the latest load to truck ratio from DAT (US shipments).



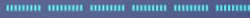

## Export/Import/Ocean:

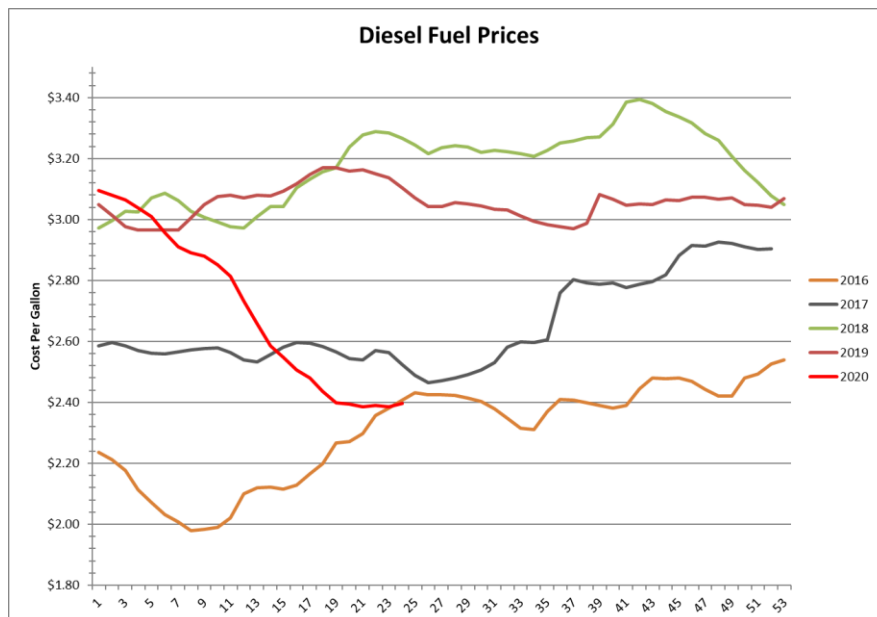
- Cargo volume at the [Port of Los Angeles](#) fell by almost 30% in May.
- The National Retail Federation's [Port Tracker report](#) indicates that the impacts from the pandemic are easing somewhat, but overall numbers are down from last year.
- United Airlines continues to expand cargo operations by adding additional flights to Europe. They are targeting key pharmaceutical markets. Currently United operating cargo flights between 6 US cities and 20 worldwide locations.
- Hapag Lloyd announced it will implement GRI in July for shipments from India to the US and Canada, effective July 3rd. Increase ranges from \$640-\$800 per container.

## Rail:

- The [Association of American Railroads](#) has reported that US weekly traffic is down 15.6% as compared to the same week last year.

## Fuel:

- The national average price per gallon this week is \$2.396. A slight increase from the prior week.



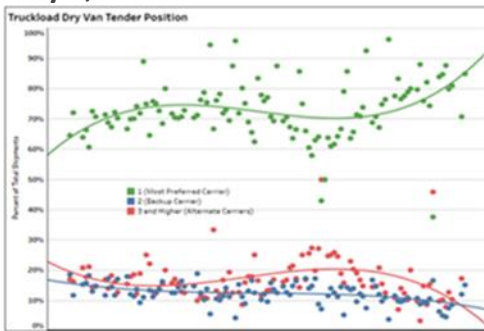

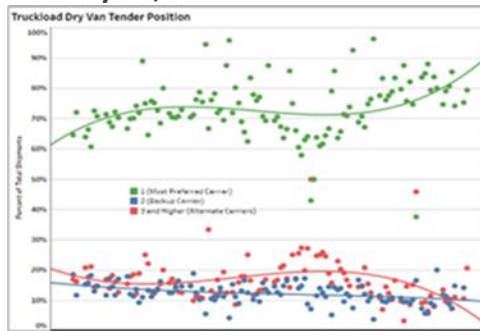
## Market Tender Position – Surge recap:

- Green dots/line represents the primary carrier, blue represents the backup carrier, red represents other alternate carrier options.

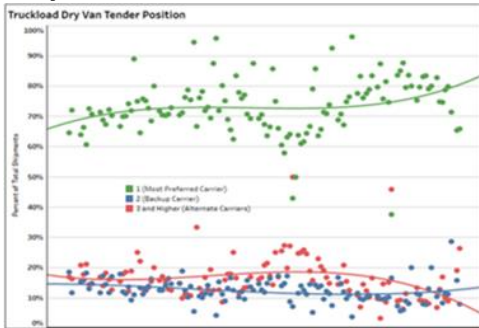

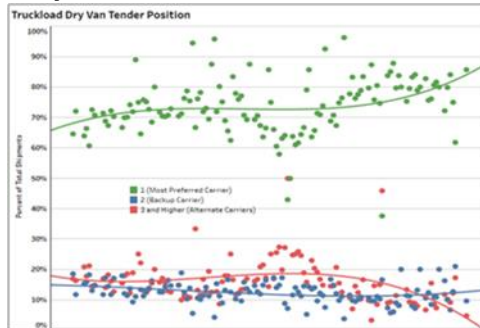

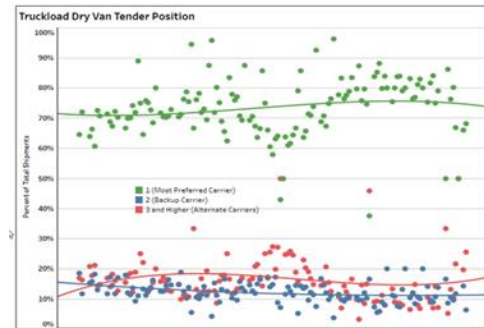

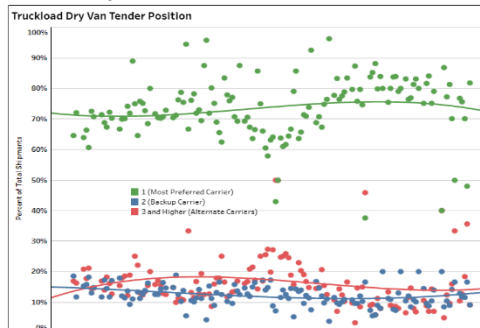
